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ABSTRACT

The research is done in Dadaab Refugee Camps in Dadaab Division the study was about the causes of low enrolment rate in pre-school. The study targeted a population of Headteachers, teachers and parents who were used to generate the data used. The researcher used survey research design which enabled her to get the required information through questionnaires and interview schedules. However the data collect was then analyzed by qualitative techniques to make it meaningful using tables.

The objective of the study was:-

- To determine the enrolment rate of pre-schools children in Dadaab refugee camps.
- To assist in finding solution to the problem of factors affecting enrolment in pre-schools in Dadaab camps.
- To educate the parents about their roles in pre-school education.
- To educate the communities about the importance of pre-school education for their children in future.
- To find out the enrolment ratio between boys and girls in pre-school children of Dadaab camps.
- To examine the parents' education level of those pupils who are attending and not attending pre-schools.

Eight pre-schools of Dadaab camps were sampled out for the study, whereby three were from Ifo camp, three were from Daghley camp and others from Hagadera camp, the researcher identified the factors that caused low enrolment witnessed in the camps. After the analysis of the factors that causes low enrolment the researcher came up with a conclusion which arrived at possible solution on how to increase the enrolment level in all Dadaab pre-schools children. Recommendations were also
